“Kibrothhattaavah,” means, “the burial of lust.” It is a much sought place for the fervent seeker of Truth. But it only comes after the Lord has smitten us with lust’s gorging. We may get what we lust for, but while we gorge ourselves on its pleasure

God will see our total disregard for His faithful provision and His wrath will be kindled against us. Our pleasure will turn into plague. Without intimacy with Truth, there is no love of God in us and the soil of our soul becomes prime planting ground for doubt and despair. *“Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever.”* Is your eye wandering away from the Love of your life to past pleasures? It’s time to bury lust with the *“Joy of the Lord.”*
