The Believer's hope is in Heaven with Christ. Their *“faith is the substance of things HOPED FOR, the evidence of THINGS NOT SEEN!”* Christmas is when we celebrate the First Coming of God as a Man (*The Word Made Flesh. John 1*). There will be a Second Coming of Christ, *“the Word Made Flesh,”* as the Glorified Eternal Risen LORD, because He Promised, *“And if I Go, I Will Come again.”* He Did Go: *“While they beheld, He was taken up; and a cloud received Him out of their sight. Even before the Great Flood, *“Enoch also, the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these, saying, ‘Behold, the Lord Cometh with ten thousands of His saints, to Execute Judgment upon all, and to Convince all that are ungodly among them of all their ungodly deeds which they have ungodly committed, and of all their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against Him.”* John the Apostle also prophesied, *“Behold, He Cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see Him, and they also which pierced Him: and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of Him!”* We all get caught up in the excitement surrounding the Christmas season, because it's a time of gift exchange and excessive commercial enterprise. The real reason for celebration is the memorial of the birth of the spotless *“Lamb of God which Taketh away the sin of the world!”* The exact birthdate of Christ, while many speculate its occurrence, is unknown. One day is as good as another if you must celebrate it, but the day Christ exhorted us to recall is the Day of His Death. As He Lifted The Cup He said, *“This do in remembrance of me!”* Sunday Assembly remembers the Day of Resurrection. The Lord's Table remembers Who secures our Hope. *“For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death TILL HE COME.”* The Lord's Table anticipates Christ's return as it recalls His Words, *“And if I Go, I Will Come Again.”*
